February 16, 1931 - May 28, 2015

Anthony Occhibove 84, of Hudson and lifelong Hudsonian, died peacefully with his family at his side on Thursday May 28, 2015 at Livingston Hills Nursing Home in Livingston. Born on February 16, 1931 in Hudson, he was the son of the late Antonio and Delia (Zailkas) Occhibove. Anthony attended St. Mary's Academy, and was a devoted communicant of St. Mary's Church. He served in the U.S. Army in the Korean War and received the Purple Heart for injuries in battle. he also received the Conspicuous Service Cross.

Anthony was a life member of Washington Hose Co. #3 in Hudson, was a member of the American Legion Post #184, V F W Post #1314 in Hudson, and the Disabled American Veterans. Anthony worked for Textile By Products in Hudson, and as a Security Guard at Olana State Historic Park and the Martin VanBuren State Historic Park before his retirement.

He is survived by his brother Robert Occhibove of Hudson, sisters: Ann Curcio of Mays Landing NJ, Shirley Smith of Great Barrington, MA, Kathleen Wildey of Greenport, many nieces, nephews, great-nieces and nephews and cousins. He was pre-deceased by sisters: Mary and Rita Occhibove.
