August 17, 1922 - April 29, 2022

Carmine Joseph Ciancetta 99, of Claverack, died peacefully on Friday April 29, 2022 at Albany Medical Center. Born on August 17, 1922 in Hudson, he was the son of the late Justino and Olympia (Lombardi) Ciancetta. Carmine served Honorably in the U.S. Navy during WWII from 1941-1945.

Carmine was the former owner/operator of Rowles Studios and was an avid musician. He played accordion for many years at events both public and private throughout Columbia and Greene Counties, as well as nursing homes to lift the spirits of all. He was a member of the Sacred Heart Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Shrine in Greenport.

He is survived by his wife of 60 years Carol A. (Palmer) Ciancetta of Claverack, one sister Marie Quigley of Hudson, and many nieces, nephews and friends.
