Born on June 9, 1948, she was the daughter of the late John and Lillian (Rasmussen) Hoffman. Gaye was the Division Director for the Mental Health Assoc. of Columbia and Greene Counties. Gaye was a volunteer and Board member of The Second Show in Hudson. She was a Taconic Hills Dollars for Scholars Board member. Gaye created and organized the Annual Pumpkin Walk for the Mental Health Association of Columbia and Greene Counties. She organized the 1st Annual Hillsdale Car Show. For many years Gaye headed the Edith Casey Stocking Fund, a century old charity that gives holiday gifts to local area children. Among her other volunteer activities Gaye worked at the Roe Jan Community Library book sales and galas. She was the loving wife of Steven Tiger of Hillsdale. In addition to her husband she is survived by one sister Bonnie Bruzda.

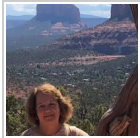
