Mary Ann "Mimi" Gregory

Mary Ann Gregory of Nyack, NY, and most recently of Philmont, NY, passed away peacefully on Saturday, April 11, 2026, at Columbia Memorial Hospital in Hudson, NY. She was 85 years old.

Born on December 10, 1940, in Brooklyn, NY, she was the daughter of the late Barney and Ann Gulotta, the sister of the late Joseph Gulotta, and the wife of the late Victor "Chuck" Gregory (<https://wavefarm.org/radio/wgxc/audio-archive/13ryhz>).

Mary Ann, known to her friends and family as Mimi, spent much of her career in the music industry. She began at Bell Records, later worked at Arista Records, and went on to serve as Vice President of National Sales at Salsoul Records. There, she supported the release of the first 12-inch 45 for retail, created by her late husband, Victor "Chuck" Gregory.

After moving to Nyack, NY, she helped her husband take Grudge Records public out of the third-floor office of their Victorian home and devoted herself to raising their daughter, Dina.

Though Mimi rarely sought the spotlight, in 1967 she quietly recorded an

album in an office on 57th Street. That album, Timeless (https://www.youtube.com/@mimi_gregory) , was released for the first time on Mother's Day in 2025. Its raw sound quality is part of its beauty—a reminder that some voices, no matter how softly sung, deserve to be heard.

Mimi's 85 years were marked by a profound depth of love and care, and an abundance of pasta, stories, songs, and laughter. She had a sharp sense of humor and a remarkable ability to make others feel seen, welcomed, and at home.

She is survived by her daughter, Dina Gregory of Pittsfield, MA.

A Celebration of Life will be held at a later date.
